A New York based pianist who has thrilled audiences at prestigious venues such as Carnegie Hall.

In the middle of his brilliant career, this miraculous musician was suddenly struck by an incurable illness called dystonia, and was diagnosed as unable to recover as a pianist for the rest of his life.

But after the intensive rehabilitation, he was finally able to move his seven fingers, now that he is able to produce a unique tone that can shake people's souls.

He was chosen to be the final performer at the Closing Ceremony of the Tokyo 2020 Paralympic Games in 2021, providing the grand finale. In 2022, Gohei Nishikawa's life story was adapted into a stage play directed by director Yutaka Narii. The role of Gohei Nishikawa was played by an EXILE member Toshio Matsumoto.

He is now attracting attention from all over the world as a one-of-a-kind pianist who has found his own "voice".
